EcoCert Members Awarded €39,000 from SEAI

Econcertive have successfully co-ordinated a grant application for three EcoCert members with the SEAI 'Better Energy Communities' scheme.

This follows from the success in the previous year, where four EcoCert members were awarded a total €81,000 in SEAI grant support.

The latest recipients and projects were;



Dundrum Town Centre for energy-saving variable speed drives on air handling units and ultra-violet coil cleaners.



Nutgrove Shopping Centre for new LED exterior lighting in the car park and buildings perimeter.



Waterford Institute of Technology for new building heating controls and LED lighting.

The combined projects will **save €55,600** per year in electricity and fuel costs, and will reduce annual carbon emissions by **207 tonnes**.

These projects see the continuation of EcoCert's **100% success record** in winning SEAI grants for member companies. By way of comparison, SEAI rejected 30% of the applications they received.

SEAI plan to run this grant scheme again in 2014 and have indicated they would welcome a further EcoCert application. It is likely that applications will be invited early in the Spring.

The new LED light, seen on the right, is considerably brighter than the old lamp on the left, and gives better illumination for the walkway below. And it uses 50% less energy!

Dungarvan Shopping Centre became the first shopping centre outside the Dublin area to achieve **EcoCert** certification.

Improvements in their energy, waste and water arrangements are set to deliver **annual savings of €20,100** for a one-off capital outlay of only €1,400.

Centre Manager Ray Coary was presented with the award at a gala event in Dún Laoghaire by An Cathaoirleach Cllr. Carrie Smyth and An Tánaiste and Minister for Foreign Affairs and Trade, Eamonn Gilmore, TD.

The award recognises the achievement of a 40% reduction in water consumption across the site.
